I just wanted to share with everyone what your council is up to. We had a very productive meeting this past Sunday. Our biggest task, of course, is finding a way to navigate through our current serious financial situation. We have several ideas that we are developing to work through this, including cost savings and money management analysis, raising parish awareness, and the establishment of a stewardship program.

At the same time, we are working on giving the parish a little bit of a "tune up", to shake us out of the rut we appear to be in. To accomplish this, we are giving a top-to-bottom review of parish and personal piety. We want our parish to be a warm, clean, and worshipful place to be. One major change is that we are restricting smoking on parish grounds to the specified smoking area, and the cigarette receptacle has been relocated to this area in the parking lot. Gwinnett county's smoking ordinance was use as a guideline to select this location. Additionally, we ask that those who do smoke, please refrain from dropping cigarette butts anywhere but the provided receptacle. Likewise, we are relocating and cleaning up recycle bins, picnic tables and other items, as well as tending to building maintenance items.

The minutes from this past parish council meeting will be posted very soon, so you can see what we're up to. We all have our work cut out for us, both at the council level and at a parish wide level. The parish council is very desirous of your prayers; and all of you are in mine!
